<b>Background</b>	0 Student does not present any background.	3 Student presents minimal background information.	6 Student presents background but not enough to support thesis.	9 Student demonstrates full knowledge of background with elaboration.	
<b>Thesis / Hypothesis</b>		0 No clear thesis is presented.	1 Thesis is too long or does not contain a hypothesis.	2 Thesis is to the point and contains a testable hypothesis.

<b>Conclusions</b>	0 Student does not present conclusions.	3 Student does not understand or relate data to conclusions.	5 Student does a good job of connecting data to conclusions.	8 Student does an excellent job of connecting data to conclusions, and includes limitations.	
<b>Questions Answered</b>	0 Questions not answered.	2 Questions not answered adequately.	4 Questions answered but not supported.	6 Questions answered clearly.	
<b>Visuals</b>	1 Presentation poorly designed.	2 Slides lack images, difficult to read text and/or too much text on slides.	3 Images on slides not labeled, text difficult to read and/or too much text on slides.	4 Slides clear, bulleted points rather than lengthy text, images included and labeled.	
<b>Verbal Content</b>	1 Student's presentation had > 4 spelling errors and/or grammatical errors.	2 Presentation had three misspellings and/or grammatical errors.	3 Presentation has ≤ 2 misspellings and/or grammatical errors.	4 Presentation has no misspellings or grammatical errors.	
<b>Delivery</b>	1 Student mumbles, incorrectly pronounces terms, and speaks too quietly for peers to hear.	2 Student incorrectly pronounces terms. Audience members have difficulty hearing presentation.	3 Student's voice is clear. Student pronounces most words correctly.	4 Student used a clear voice and correct, precise pronunciation of terms.
